These areas are gray covered shelters located in Lots B, L, M, and N. Refer to the map key to identify the smoking shelter locations.


Marijuana use is strictly forbidden on campus in any form. Even if you are a valid card holder.

Crime Prevention

- Avoid taking shortcuts through isolated areas.
- Avoid walking alone.
- Remain aware of what is going on around you. Walk with your head up. Make eye-contact with those you pass. Walk with a purpose.
- When approaching your vehicle, have your keys ready. Glance in and around your vehicle.
- Trust your instincts. If something doesn't feel right, it probably isn't. Call Public Safety: 541-463-5558.
- Never leave valuables unattended. It's best to leave unnecessary valuables/money at home.
- Engrave your driver's license or ID number on valuables.
- When parking your vehicle on campus, secure all doors and windows, and avoid leaving valuables in your car. If you must leave valuables in your vehicle, lock them in your trunk and out of plain view.
- At night, park in well-lit areas.
- If you see something, say something. Always report crime or suspected criminal activity.
