## Response

Where a sexual assault has occurred, the Campus Public Safety Department will provide the following trauma informed care:

- Ensure the survivor feels safe and has access to immediate medical attention.
- Inform and make decisions that include the individual to ensure transparency and build trust.
- Present information to them about on and off campus resources and victim legal rights.
- Validate the individual regarding their experience/trauma and work to create a safe and non-judgmental environment.
- Take proactive steps with regard for the individuals who have been affected.
- Notify proper law enforcement agency and assist the victim/survivor with the transfer of information to the assisting agency.

Our highest priority is survivor safety. Campus Public Safety is a safe space for all individuals, we prioritize non-discriminatory actions and value our student and staff's privacy and personal choices. We are here to serve and protect our community, and in the process we maintain professionalism and build trust.

## Directions to Public Safety

### Directions from 15:

Take the College Exit 198 towards 30th Ave. Turn left at the light onto Eldon Shafer Drive.

Drive South on Eldon Shafer Dr. and turn into lot M (access through gates 7-9).

Public Safety building 12 is located directly West of and below lot M.

### Directions from East 30th Avenue:

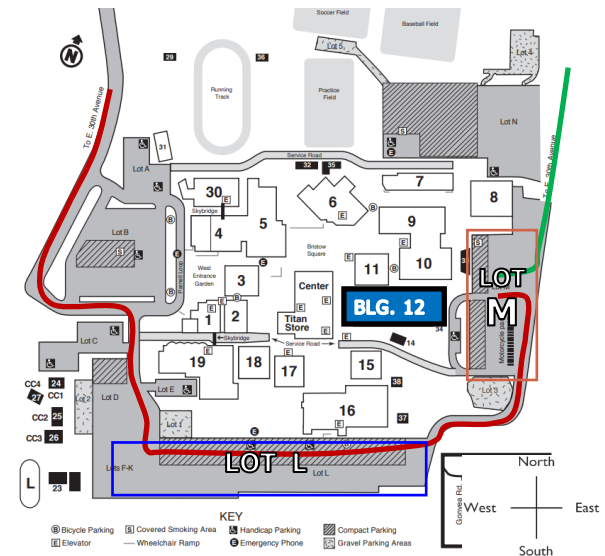
When heading East on 30th Ave, take the college ramp exit for Gonyea Road. This puts you on the West side of campus.

Continue on Gonyea Rd. as you enter campus, you will stay in the right lane, and follow until you come to lot L.

Take a left into lot L (now traveling East) and follow until you exit the parking lot and reach the East side of campus which turns into Eldon Shafer Drive.

Turn into lot M (access through gates 7-9)

Public Safety building 12 is located directly West of and below lot M.



Enter Building 12 on the North side for access to Campus Public Safety.
