LETS Program Allocation Guidelines

LETS is a technology-focused student employment initiative. Funding for the LETS program comes from the technology fee that students pay and is based on the number of credits enrolled at the college.

The general criteria for selection are:

- Technology-based jobs to help students gain experience and hands-on training related to their major.
- Positions where students directly help other students succeed and technology is a significant factor.
- Positions based on student retention efforts.

Examples of these positions include:

- Computer lab aides and tutors
- Classroom assistants in technology-related courses
- Technology-related helpdesk assistants

Positions that are inappropriate for LETS funding requests include:

- Reception and phone duties
- Data entry
- Grading of student assignments
- Departmental webpage editing/updating
- Social media (with the exception of the Marketing and Media Arts Departments)
