## **Getting Started**

- 1. Visit lanecc.edu/apprenticeship to obtain program details.
- Contact the Committee Coordinator listed per trade. Check their website frequently for current openings.
- 3. Prepare application portfolio and apply with committee during their opening period.

Minimum Qualifications to apply:

- Must be 18 years of age or older
- Must have high school diploma or GED
- Must have completed one year of high school algebra (or equivalent postsecondary course) with a grade of C or better or an equivalent college placement test
- 4. Enroll in college classes to prepare for your trade and/or earn points for some apprenticeship applications.
